Immediate Past District Governor As members of Lions Clubs, we signed up with one thought in mind, to provide aid and comfort to those in need. Now, more than ever, we ask ourselves, what can we do to help in this crisis? Here are some thoughts you may wish to consider.

- Home Health Care, check on your neighbors and club members regularly by calling. If you are healthy and you have the means to do so, make an effort to help those that are most vulnerable in your community. If you know of elderly neighbors who can not make it to the store, offer to pick up groceries, prescriptions, and other supplies and offer to bring them meals, you can arrange to leave them on the porch, so you do not risk exposure. This is simple and very doable service resulting in considerable returns.
- Food Shortages, under normal circumstances, a simple food drive yields vast results from the generosity of the public. Under the current circumstances, we are discouraged from having person to person contact. In light of this, an alternative in aiding food pantries suffering from drastic food shortages is by making monetary donations. Clubs with the means to make monetary donations, this is the time to do so. Every dollar donated to food banks, soup kitchens, and charities of the same will benefit many in need and goes a long way in feeding the need. Simple and very doable service resulting in considerable returns.
- Blood Shortage, blood banks are suffering as well. Blood banks typically suffer yearround from shortages. The Food and Drug Administration and American Red Cross are urging healthy individuals to donate blood as blood drives are being canceled nationwide, putting blood supply at potential risk as concerns over the novel coronavirus pandemic grow. A single pint of Life Saving blood can potentially serve three people in dire need. There is no cause of anxiety or alarm in donating the Gift of Life. Again, this is simple and very doable service resulting in considerable returns.
- Lion members are encouraged to contact their community elected officials, local churches, and community organizations to seek other means of service that Lions may be able to fulfill.
